
Concert season starts at the end of the marching season. Members practice together for one hour every school day, not to mention the hours they spend on their own, learning music for their numerous concerts.


The primary function of the Student Council is to co-operate in the government of the school and to create a better relationship between students and the faculty. The Council is interested in all projects that will benefit our school.


### Latin Club
